The Vestry and I then had a mutual ministry review. With a positive outcome, the Vestry issued a call for me to be your rector, I accepted, and the Bishop then approved it. All of that happened this past September just before Bishop Shannon retired at the beginning of November. But this isn't just about me, it is about **us** and finally celebrating the hard work of the Search Committee that put in countless hours finding consensus and writing a profile, communicating with candidates, and listening to you; it is about celebrating the work of not just one Vestry but four different Vestries and Wardens as we have worked and grown together in our mutual ministries. And at the center of all this, it is about celebrating the work of the Holy Spirit and carrying out the work of our Lord Jesus Christ in this place and sharing his love as each opportunity presents itself.

The other aspect of this service made me realize that celebrating our ministry together and renewing that commitment is no different than the other celebration that will take place in the context of this service. That is when seven individuals, who were baptized, or baptized and

That is when seven individuals, who were baptized, or baptized and confirmed years ago, will publically reaffirm their baptismal vows and commitment to Christ through Confirmation, Reception, or Reaffirmation. Some have been worshipping with us for years and others more recently. What is the difference in these three things? **Confirmation** is a chance to "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop." (BCP 860) **Reception** is for individuals who were confirmed in another tradition (Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and many Lutheran churches by a bishop) and desire to make a public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their baptism in the presence of an Episcopal bishop and be received into the Episcopal Church. **Reaffirmation** is for individuals who have been confirmed or received and who wish to reaffirm those promises and receive the laying on of hands with prayers for strength to continue in the service of Christ in his kingdom.

Please join us in this celebration by your presence and if you are unable to be with us, then join us through your prayers.
