Father Stuart's Message for September 2017

Each Sunday at the 8:00 a.m. service we hear these words at the beginning of Rite I:

Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ saith:

Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

When a lawyer put Jesus to the test asking, "who is my neighbor Jesus responded with the parable of the Good Samaritan. As yo may know, the Samaritan was about the last person on earth that this man would have considered to be his neighbor. Samaritans were a despised and rejected people and yet Jesus taught us qu clearly that all people are our neighbors.

Our own baptismal covenant directs us to strive for justice and peace among all people and to respect the dignity of every huma being.

Thankfully, I was raised to love all people and to see everyone as my neighbor. But in spite of that, I find that I still struggle with "preconceived opinions that aren't based on reason or actual exp rience but which can still lead to a dislike, hostility, or unjust beha ior deriving from unfounded opinions toward others," or in a singl word "prejudice."

I love history and I literally grew up on the Petersburg National Battle Field Park where the Crater is located. I played in the forts and on the earthworks, in the trenches, and was surrounded by images of the Civil War. Many of my ancestors fought for the Confederacy and that is something that I can't change any more than I can change history.

But the violence that we see growing across our country is hurtful and simply un-Christian in character. Robert E. Lee wrote in a 1869 letter regarding war monuments, "I think it wiser, moreover, not to keep open the sores of war, but to follow the example of those nations who endeavored to obliterate the marks of civil strife, and to commit to oblivion the feelings it engendered."

Though our Judeo-Christian heritage often has us looking back to the mighty acts of God and celebrating them in special feasts and celebra-?" tions, it also calls us to look forward to the fulfillment of God's promises, to be reconcilers, and to love one another as he loves us.

Hanging on to prejudice and grudges are no way for us to fulfill these promises of the peaceable Kingdom of God because to borrow again ite from the words of Robert E. Lee, this will only "separate and destroy families and friends, and mar the purest joys and happiness God has granted us in this world; to fill our hearts with hatred instead of love for n our neighbours, and to devastate the fair face of this beautiful world!" -Dec. 25, 1862
