Thoughts From Our Rector



One evening, as I was out for an evening walk, I suddenly took notice of the very distinct shadow that stretched out in front of me. I watched the shadow move along with every step that I made. Whenever I entered into the shade of a tree, the shadow would disappear until I walked clear of the shade. But there it was once again, as distinct and defined as it was before. If I turned to the left, the shadow turned to the left and followed me on my right side, if I turned to the right, the shadow turned right and followed me on my left side, and if I turned around and

walked in the direction of the sun, there was that shadow following me from behind. Have you ever seen a very young child when he or she first discovers their shadow? Some will be excited by it and others may try to run away from it and become frightened when they see that it chases right after them.

As I continued to walk along watching my shadow, I began thinking about it from a spiritual point of view. I began seeing that shadow, not as my shadow, but as God's shadow and realized that wherever I am, God is ever-present either leading me along, following where I've been, walking beneath me, or right beside me. Depending on the angle of the sun, the shadow may stretch out well in front or behind me, and at other times, the shadow is very close. But no matter its length, it is always touching me.

Oftentimes, we pay little or no attention to that shadow, often taking it for granted. If we're not careful, we find ourselves doing the very same thing with our relationship with God. The Psalmist found comfort and strength from God's shadow. Here are some of the verses from the Psalms. Psalm 91:1 - He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High, abides under the **shadow** of the Almighty. And Psalm 17:8-9 - Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me under the **shadow** of your wings, from the wicked who assault me, from my deadly enemies who surround me.

The Psalmist found God's shadow as a place of comfort, rest, and safety. God wants each of us to be mindful of his presence in our lives at all times. Maybe in those times that we're not able to see our shadow, because of the shade or darkness, couldn't that be God's shadow taking in our shadow as he wraps himself around us. Instead of seeing those dark moments as times when we feel that God is absent from our life, try seeing it as God wrapping us in his love taking in our shadow with his, and making us one

Maybe, just maybe, that is what St. Patrick had in mind in these words that are attributed to him. "Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ in comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

So the next time that you are walking along and notice your shadow close by, let it remind you that our Lord walks with you shadowing your every move lest you should stumble and fall.
