

From Our Rector



I am not a debater, nor a politician, I don't like getting into arguments or fights, when others hurt, I hurt, when others mourn, I mourn, and when others are happy, I'm happy. Unfortunately, our world is currently filled with more sorrow and pain than it is joy. The war in Ukraine is still taking innocent souls and destroying the peaceful happy lives of millions in that country and also for thousands of families in Russia who have lost loved ones in a conflict that was unprovoked. Soaring inflation has affected lives around the globe. The mass shooting in Uvalde, TX has been the most devastating event of this week. The grief associated with the loss of a child is unimaginable and it leaves a void in peoples' lives that can't be filled. The emotional scars that will impact everyone who lived through those nightmares may never be erased. I wonder what will it be like for those teachers and young students to ever feel safe again, especially in a classroom.

We are nearing the end of the Easter season as we approach the celebration of Pentecost. But we need to remember that Easter was preceded by Good Friday which left the disciples cowering in fear in a locked room, afraid for their lives, and devastated by grief and loss that they may have thought would never end. Would their mourning ever find peace? Would they ever feel safe venturing out into the world again for fear of the Jews and the Roman authorities? Would this nightmare end? But by the power of God's love, it did! Easter restored life where there was only death. Fear was replaced with hope, mourning with gladness. Still unsure of themselves, Pentecost came and filled them with the fire of God's love. The Holy Spirit transformed their lives, giving them the confidence and the will to carry on, to venture out, and to share the Good News of Christ's redeeming work with a broken, oppressed, and hurting world.

Jesus once quoted the Prophet Isaiah saying, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim

the year of the Lord's favor." And then said, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." The Lord later commissioned the disciples to go and do the same thing.



What is this Elephant???

This month's article is intended to review with the congregation just what is this "Elephant Committee" and what is its purpose; who are the "Elephants" and what have they been doing; and most importantly, how does the congregation fit into this Elephant and what is our plan? So please continue reading!!!

Five months ago, an article in our January Newsletter introduced the "Elephant in the Room" as being a declining membership and attendance at our Church. The Vestry had acknowledged this and called for an ad-hoc committee to corral this "elephant". A request was made that if you had any thoughts or ideas and felt you could help, to please contact Jeff Loustaunau. This resulted in ten very dedicated and energetic parishioners coming together to form the "Elephant Committee". They are Pam

McClelland, John Hilliard, Lydia Dudley, David South, Grace Parker, Bev Hart, Mary Lynn Landgraf, Judy Quilter, Ann de Peyster, and Jeff Loustaunau. At our first meeting, we developed a purpose statement that reads:

TO DEVELOP AND CHAMPION STRATEGIES TO GROW OUR CHURCH IN PRAYERFUL DISCIPLINE AND AS A COMMUNITY

IN A WAY THAT:

ACCEPTS RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR SITUATION

DEFINES THE ISSUE BASED ON DATA

UTILIZES OUR STRENGTHS

INVOLVES AND MOTIVATES THE ENTIRE CONGREGATION

We found several resources that have helped guide our thoughts and actions during our first meetings. They include several books:

Anatomy of a Revived Church

The Post Quarantine Church

The Death and Resurrection of the Episcopal Church

Sizing up a Congregation for New Member Ministry

as well as studying the latest Middlesex County Census Data and conferring with Rt. Rev. Jennifer Brooke-Davidson from the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia.

What did we learn? To start with we learned that every member of our congregation needs to be a part of corralling this “elephant”. It’s not up to others. It is up to us. We also know that in Middlesex County, 60% of our population is 45 years and older and that recently many people are moving to the County for retirement or because they can work remotely. Those people may be looking for a church home!

In looking at our strengths, our facilities at Christ Church Parish are second to none in the County. And more importantly, our parishioners are some of the most friendly and active people in our entire community, and in fact, are hard to keep up with! We are a great Church Community!!!

Here are some of the things the Elephant Committee has been working on. We have been calling everyone that has been on our rolls that we have not seen in church lately. That has resulted in several people starting to reappear at our Sunday services and special events. We have been encouraging our ministries to revive several of our social events. Another focus has been to publicize what we are doing, resulting in several articles in the Southside Sentinel and posts on our Facebook page. We have also started a Eucharistic Service in the chapel at Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury on the first Wednesday of the month for our members and non-members. We are finally ordering our new sign to replace the one by our flagpole. And we do have two new couples who have joined the church this year.

So what now?

As we have said before, the “Elephant in the Room” is our declining membership, and based on our strengths, we have a great opportunity to turn that around by doing two major things. First, many of us have new neighbors who have recently moved in. Let’s invite them to our church or at least to a special event. As Bishop Jennifer suggested too, we need to have a conversation with our new neighbors about what they are looking for in a church home. Let’s see how we match up to their needs?

Secondly, we have been getting visitors to our services over the past several weeks. These visitors, along with our invited guests, need to be truly welcomed to our church. We used to do this, but probably because of COVID, we may be out of practice. Here are some simple things ALL OF US can do or can ensure are being done.

Wear your name tag so visitors can easily see who they are speaking with. If you don’t have one, see Tonya in the office and she can order you one.

When you see a visitor, find out who they are and where they’re from. It is especially important to get a name, phone number, and email address. Have them sign the guest book in the

Introduce them to Father Stuart, Deacon Peg and your friends.

Ensure they get a mug.

Bring them to our coffee hour.

On all of these we might say that the responsibility belongs to the Ushers and/or to the Vestry. And yes it does, but they also need help! The responsibility really falls to all of us to help each other accomplish the above.

We have a wonderful Video from Ann De Peyster that says a lot about our facilities, parishioners and our ministries that we can send to visitors right after they visit as long as we have an email address or a phone number to call them.

We need to have a follow-up call with them within two days from either Father Stuart, the Vestry, or someone to show how pleased we were to meet them and hope to see them again.

And we have many special events going on now that we can invite them to.

In looking at the above list, we should all be saying "There is nothing new here. We have always done that." And you would be correct. But it has been a while since we have really "practiced that".

For the sake of all of us and for those who could greatly benefit from our vibrant church community, let's all get involved in bringing our friends and neighbors to our church in a way that lets them know it is a great place for all of us!



Catechism Corner

Mission: A small corner of faith, understanding and education



Topics are mostly edited quotes (generally for space) taken from the Book of Common Prayer (p.844) and are meant to be a departure point for further exploration, study and learning. This month's section starts on p.860 in the Book of Common Prayer (BCP).

Beyond the Eucharist, Other Sacramental Rites

Other sacramental rites evolved in the Church under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and include confirmation, ordination, holy matrimony, reconciliation of a penitent, and unction.

They differ from the two sacraments of the Gospel although they are means of grace, they are not necessary for all persons in the same way that Baptism and the Eucharist are.

Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

Those to be confirmed must have been baptized, and: are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins. and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Ordination is the rite in which God gives authority and the grace of the Holy Spirit to those being made bishops, priests, and deacons, through prayer and the laying on of hands by bishops.
